



The old lookout, now the Halte des Nations, located on Esplanade Street, between Queen and Vanier streets, has been completely redesigned and inaugurated on July 2nd, 2003. The wave-shape wood benches symbolize water and the banners present the 25 nations that participated in the 10th water ski world championship in 1967, event in which Mr. Jean Perrault, current mayor of the City of Sherbrooke, participated as a member of the Canadian team. This page in history is now explained on an interpretive panel realized by Sherbrooke's Museum of Nature and Science.

Already, several visitors have put on their skates or hopped on their bicycles to use the cycling path of the lake's north shore. Others prefer to walk on the path, close to the water, and next to magnificent landscaping and bold trees. Youths meet at the fountain while little ones have fun around the fountain jets at the Halte des Nations.
